KIM NG: In A World of Mist



Kim Ng, a multi-disciplinary artist, embarks on an unconventional artistic journey by embracing an innovative approach to mixed media. He deftly employs silkscreen printing and printed materials as his primary mediums to craft intricate collages, masterfully merging canvas and paper-mache structures. These works are more than visually captivating; they resonate deeply, provoking profound contemplation. Yet, what sets Kim Ng apart in the realm of contemporary art is his unique wellspring of inspiration: local street maps. The act of physically cutting, tearing, and layering these materials onto the canvas becomes a profound symbolic act in Kim Ng's work, portraying how our understanding of reality is constructed from a multitude of sources.

Kim Ng's creative process harmoniously fuses meticulous planning and spontaneous improvisation. He begins by painstakingly selecting street maps from three significant cities: his hometown of Ipoh in Perak, the bustling metropolis of Kuala Lumpur in Wilayah Persekutuan, and the serene enclave of Kluang in Johor, each map carefully chosen to resonate with his intended themes. These maps form the foundational layer of his collages, symbolizing the established order underlying our societies. The juxtaposition of diverse printed materials further hints at the multifaceted nature of perspectives and narratives that shape our understanding of events. Among Kim Ng's most remarkable achievements is his ability to infuse his art with a profound sense of unity despite the inherent diversity of his materials.

What truly makes Kim Ng's work distinguishable is his skillful exploration of the intricate interplay between order and chaos. Street maps, once symbols of structured navigation, now

serve as potent metaphors for the fragility of established systems in the face of rapid change. Kim Ng's collages boldly depict these maps torn, rearranged, and distorted, visually symbolizing the disruption that social and political phenomena introduce into our lives. These maps, simultaneously representing physical and metaphorical boundaries, become vehicles for transcending conventional thinking, reflecting our collective yearning to explore fresh perspectives. Kim Ng's work emerges as a poignant commentary on the disorientation that characterizes our times, capturing the tumultuous atmosphere of a world awash with conflicting narratives and ideologies, where the very foundations of our understanding seem to be unraveling. In fusing the visual language of maps with the unbridled energy of collage, Kim Ng offers a powerful visual representation of the post-truth era.










Layers of Disorientation Mixed Media 128cm x 97cm 2023 RM 10,500




Confluence of Chaos and Order Mixed Media 150cm x 110cm 2023 RM 14,000







LIU CHENG HUA : Synergy Series



Liu Cheng Hua's Synergy Series draws profound inspiration from Malaysia's national flower, the Hibiscus Rosa-Sinensis, affectionately known as the Bunga Raya in Malay. The Bunga Raya carries immense cultural and symbolic weight in Malaysia, having been chosen as the national flower for its multifaceted significance. Embodying values such as Unity, Strength, Resilience, Natural Beauty, Traditional Heritage, and Patriotism, the Bunga Raya stands as a testament to the rich tapestry of Malaysian identity.

The word "Raya" in Bunga Raya translates to "happening" or "celebration" in the Malay language, and the flower's five petals symbolize the five pillars of the nation, encapsulated in the Rukun Negara. Beyond its numerical symbolism, the Bunga Raya epitomizes the unity amidst diversity that characterizes Malaysia. In a nation known for its multi-ethnic and multicultural composition, the vibrant and colorful petals of the Hibiscus reflect the convergence of diverse races, cultures, and backgrounds to craft a harmonious and inclusive society. Moreover, the resilience and hardiness of the Hibiscus mirror the tenacity of the Malaysian people in surmounting challenges and adversities.

In the Synergy Series, Liu Cheng Hua masterfully incorporates the colors of the Malaysian flag – red, yellow, blue, and black – which are creatively transformed into a pop palette of pink, dark red, light blue, dark blue, orange, peach, brown, grey, light grey, dark grey, and yellow. Each individual Bunga Raya in the series is meticulously handcrafted by the artist, fashioned from metal, and affixed to a wooden panel. Liu further enriches the panels with his written narratives, delving into the history and profound meanings associated with the Bunga Raya. Notably, each Hibiscus is rendered in a pristine white hue, signifying purity and cleanliness while establishing a contemporary visual dimension. Through the Synergy Series, Liu Cheng Hua invites viewers to explore the layered symbolism of the Bunga Raya in a unique fusion of artistry and cultural heritage.








